“ Just today I have learned of Leon's passing and I certainly want to express my sincere sympathy to the family. Leon and I were freshmen together at MU in the fall of 1964 and had many classes together often sitting next to each other due to teachers assigning seats alphabetically. We were both in Airforce ROTC in 1964-65; but, with the government deciding to drop the required two years of ROTC of all men at public universities in the summer of 1965 like most, we bailed out of ROTC. However as I recall (sure wish Leon was here to confirm my memory) I spent about six weeks during the fall semester convincing Leon and one other colleague from Centralia, MO that we should reup in AFROTC. Unfortunately I failed the physical and was not accepted into the ROTC program. I attempted unsuccessfully several times last fall to reach Leon as I wanted to thank him for his service and also ask him if he could remember the other College of Agriculture person who reenrolled in the AFROTC program in the fall of 1965.

P.S. The last time I saw Leon was the first Friday in November in the fall of 1974 when he came to Columbia to attend a Performance-Tested Bull Sale. I will never forget his first words when he saw me which were "damn you Jesse for convincing me to reenroll in AFROTC."
