Vietnam Service Medal and National Defense Service Medal. His occupation in the Marine Corps was listed as an Aircraft Jet Engine Mechanic.

Brown, held several jobs until finding his calling as a Baptist Preacher at the Pedon Chapel Church where

he met his wife Rosetta Brown and his step-daughters. Lloyd was a wonderful husband, father and

grandfather to his entire family. He was also known as a man who would give the shirt off his back to

help a person in need.

In the last few days of his life he kept telling his family that he was ready to go home and be with Jesus.

He lived his life to the fullest and praised the name of Jesus daily. He is in a far better place today and

will be missed by family and friends alike.
